Poster Guidelines

The Conference Planning Committee invites you to showcase your practice innovation or research by submitting a poster proposal. Posters will be displayed and presenters will be given times to discuss the poster with attendees during the meeting on November 11 and 12 at the Great Wolf Lodge in Mason, Ohio.

Purpose: To provide a forum for presentation of nurse practitioner research or innovations in practice. We are looking for abstracts with strong clinical applicability, evidence-based practice implications, innovative role development, and topics with a future oriented perspective.

For practice innovation topics, the abstract should include details about the project, case, role, target population, and measurable outcomes. The following areas should be addressed: background, goals of change, details of innovation, outcome, implications, demonstration of improvement, evaluation of change, lessons learned.

For research proposals, the abstract should include purpose, background and significance, research question or hypothesis, methods (design, sample, IRB approval status, data analysis), findings, and implications.

Abstract Requirements:

- 1) Practice Innovations or Research
- 2) Abstract Title
- 3) Abstract Summary (maximum of 500 words)
- 4) Author information to include names, affiliated institutions, degrees, certifications and licensure, and a brief biographical sketch or CV for all authors
- 5) Speaker declarations of any financial interests or affiliations with organizations that could be perceived as a conflict of interest in the context of the subject of this poster

Application Review Process

Abstracts will be forwarded to members of the Conference Planning Committee for blinded review and evaluation. Preference will be given to abstracts with strong clinical applicability, original concepts, important topics for pediatric advanced practice nursing, innovative role development, and future oriented perspective. Applications must be submitted to Holly Pfriem at Holly.Pfriem@cchmc.org by October 21. The review process will be completed by November 1. You will be notified by November 4 of the committee's decision.

No travel allowance, conference fee or lodging will be provided for poster presenters.
